3. Increasing the range of sports and activities on offer
4. Increase opportunities for participation in a variety of competitive sporting activities
5. Provide opportunities for participation in additional extra-curricular sports
6. Invest in the sustainability of PE and sport beyond Sports Premium
7. Increase the proficiency of swimming across the school
8. Provide opportunities for the least active children to take part in physical activity
9. Increase links with local clubs, facilities and events so that pupils know what is available to them.

## Objectives For Sports Premium St Joseph's RC Primary School

At St Joseph's RC Primary School we strive to deliver a rich and varied PE curriculum and we are committed to engage more pupils in extra-curricular sporting activities and events. We aim to ensure that;

- all children benefit regardless of sporting ability
- all children are given the opportunity to experience new and exciting sporting activities
- all children are given the opportunity to compete in competitions with other schools
- all staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development
- some activities may be subsidised so that pupils do not miss out due to financial constraints
- we make use of collaborative and partnership working.
- PE is sustainable beyond 2023/ 2024 by investing in equipment, activities which children may take up outside of school and links are created with other schools & clubs for competition can continue, should the School Sports Partnerships end.

## Impact 2022 – 2023

### Swimming:

92% of all pupils can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.

81% of pupils can use a range of strokes effectively, for example front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke.

81% perform safe self-rescue in different water based situations.

Throughout the year, all teaching assistants have supported in PE lessons and have been able to ably support groups and individual children.

Specialist sports coaches have delivered cricket and tag rugby to all children from KS1 – KS2. TriKidz, DRUHM, cross country all year groups

KS1 - All children have been to Graystones scootering/skateboarding

KS2 – children have participated in a variety of activities at Salford Watersports Centre

Year 6 children - golf day in school
